HULL SCHOOL SPORTS

Grammar School Champion Won Every Senior Event

SOMETHING of a record in records was set up at Hull Grammar School sports held on the school field, Endike-lane, yesterday, when M. F. Kenny won every event on the senior programme. He became senior champion with a maximum score of 72 points.

Most outstanding of Kenny's performances was a new school high jump record of 5ft. 6in., a remarkable height for a boy.

The inter-house contest was one of the closest for many years. The crucial event was the senior relay. If Marvel won they would win the championship; if Gee won it would be a tie.

Kenny was running the last 220 yards for Gee. He took over the baton a dozen yards behind the Marvel man, who was in the lead. Very wisely he went all out for the first 150 yards, and was up to his opponent's shoulder as they entered the straight.

For a moment it looked as though Kenny had shot his bolt, but with magnificent determination he fought his way into the lead, and won by a bare foot.

The result of the inter-house contest was: Marvel and Gee, equal, 139 points; 3. Wilberforce, 104 points; 4. Alcock, 69.
